2 The Ivy Bridge



Monks used to cross this bridge to get to Buckfastleigh. The bridge is a meeting point of four old parishes, Ugborough, Cornwood, Harford and Ermington.

9 The Paper Mill

The original Paper Mill was built in 1787. The oldest part of the current Paper Mill was built in 1862, and the newer part (made with red bricks) was built in 1914 as well as the large towering chimney which looks like a large brown lighthouse.



14 Pound Farm



The original Pound Farm building was built in 1561 so it is over 400 years old! That is very old indeed. The stone which the building is made from is Granite. Granite is very strong and heavy rock. The stone is amazing. There are so many different colours such as coal black, misty grey and sunset orange.

Young Visions of Old Ivybridge

Hundreds of years of local Ivybridge history has been given the incomparable freshness of a child's vision in a unique, 12-page, local heritage guide book. With the assistance of Ivybridge Town Council, a Heritage Lottery Fund grant and the support of the Devon Arts Into Schools Initiative (DAISI), this is the first guide of its kind to be published.

The guide book *Young explorers' guide to historic Ivybridge*, is now available at a cost of £1 from Ivybridge Town Council, Erme Court and the Tourist Information Centre.

Children from Ivybridge's four primary schools Woodlands Park, Stowford, Manor and Erme - were involved in the project. They produced imaginative and bright drawings and collages, photographs and written descriptions of 14 important sites including the medieval Ivy Bridge itself, Stowford Mill and St. Johns Church.

Teachers from each of the schools, a professional artist, photographer, writer and design agency aided the children in their research and creative work.

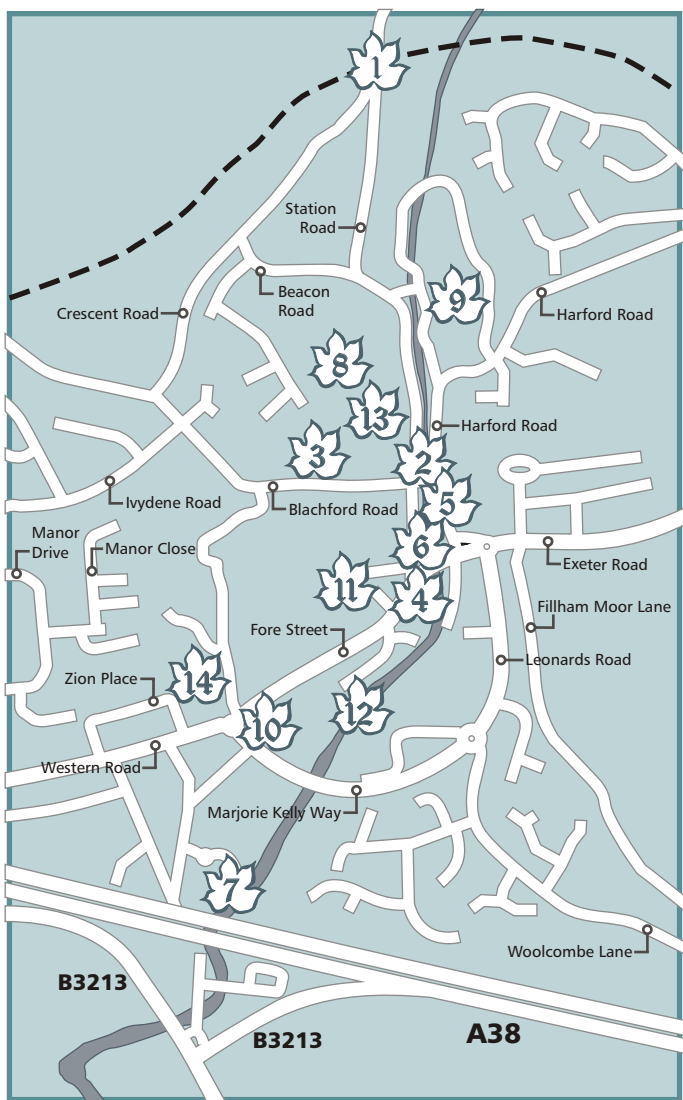

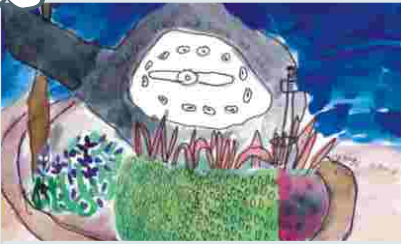
