- Filham Consultation, and Masterplan now in place and Section 106 funding ring-fenced to deliver £100ks of improvements
- Butterpark to be used to create homes for local people and adults with learning disabilities

- Art workshops in partnership with the Clay Factory and talented local artists

- Working with local businesses to develop positive returns for the community

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




Realistically, what would be acceptable things South Hams could do to help you continue to use the town centre during the construction period?





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


How do you feel the final plans will affect the following:




Thinking about the 'Regeneration' project in general, what would be your response to South Hams District Council:



Do you work in lyybridge town centre? 317 responses




