### BACKGROUND

The following request has been received from Francis Reis, Squadron Leader RAFAC

Officer Commanding 339 (South Dartmoor) Squadron, Royal Air Force Air Cadets

"The Town Council kindly gave 339(South Dartmoor)Sqn permission to use the Park Area and the Car Park outside the Joint Cadet Centre.

The attached is the record of the email you sent to Sqn Ldr Adrian Corfield, who was the officer commanding back in 2015.

Our rule book has since changed, and we need to have regular updated permissions.

Would it be possible for the Town Council a new updated permission to me please?"

Squadron Leader Reis subsequently provided Risk Assessments for all activities and a covering letter confirming the MoD's insurance arrangements for Cadet authorised activities.

In response to the Assistant Town Clerk's further enquiry regarding details of activities, Squadron Leader Reis confirmed the following:

"No Camping, though we would like to practice putting tents up and down the back packing type, cadets who do DofE and Ten Tors need to be really proficient in doing this especially in bad weather.

The attached is an out-of-date application to my chain of command for permission to train outside the squadron building, that is why I am seeking updated permissions from the ITC, because the last dated permissions from you go back to 2015. You will see the attached RA in the document is of a different style and out dated.

The type of training is the very basic military skills of camouflage and concealment, how to make basic shelters, but not cutting any of the greenery or trees, but using equipment from the squadron. Navigation and micro navigation, sport of all type suited to both male and females together. Drill in the car park area.

We can only train if we have the right staff ratios and 1<sup>st</sup> aiders present."

# **MEETING REPORT**

Members should note that the existing extended squadron footprint application from 2015 incorporates the area of land next to the cadet hut and allotments.

PROPOSAL: To update the permission given to 339 (South Dartmoor) Sqn permission to use Filham Park and surrounding areas outside the Joint Cadet Centre.

## **APPLICATION FOR EXTENDED SQUADRON FOOTPRINT**

Authorisation for an extended unit footprint is sought for the area and activities described below.

#### REF: ACFTI No. 1

**Extended Sqn Footprint (ESF)** An area within the local vicinity, but outside of the immediate Sqn perimeter, that may be used by Sqns on a normal Sqn night to conduct ACO activities as part of the Sqn programme. The ESF is an approved safe local training area outside the Sqn bounds in which low-risk activities may be undertaken during Sqn training evenings.

**Local Training**. Local training is defined as training undertaken within the bounds of the Sqn perimeter or the agreed Extended Sqn Footprint (ESF) as part of the Sqn training programme. It includes classroom lessons and local Consolidated Practical Training.

### AREA

#### Area Name: Filham Park, Ivybridge

**Area Description:** Lane leading to car park and grounds outside the lvybridge Cadet Centre including a fenced off allotments and into large (approx 38 acre) field with tarmac public footpaths. Field contains large fishing lake which is completely fenced off by 1.5 metre continuous fence and secure gates, and cricket ground which is also fenced off by continuous 1.5 metre high fence. The whole field is fenced and hedges around the entire perimeter apart from the locking gates. The field is mainly grass but also has several trees (many planted by the Squadron cadets in conjunction with the Town Council). Training area excludes the fenced off fishing lake, allotments and cricket ground.

**Public Rights of Way:** The public have full access to the location except for the fishing lake and cricket ground which are accessed by members only.

**Land Owner:** The landowner is lvybridge Town Council. Permission for our intended use has been obtained and a copy is attached.


